In Mesopotamian conceptions of the afterlife, life did not end after physical death but continued in the form of an *emmu*, a spirit or ghost dwelling in the netherworld. Further, physical death did not sever the relationship between living and deceased but reinforced their bond through a new set of mutual obligations.
