Translated as the Women's League, Cumann na mBan was originally formed as an auxiliary formation to complement the Irish Volunteers. Cumann na mBan was officially founded on the 5th April 1914 at a meeting in held Wynne's Hotel, Dublin led by Kathleen Lane-O'Kelley.

The second Cumann na mBan member killed was Margaret Keogh, a nineteen-year-old printer's assistant, who was fatally wounded by a gunshot in her home at Stella Gardens, Ringsend, Dublin, at 11.15pm on 10 July 1921 during a series of raids by Crown forces on the eve of the truce that ended the War of Independence.

Cumann na mBan members opposed the Treaty by a huge majority. Women certainly stood to lose by a compromise settlement; it was clear that their rights would only be guaranteed by a Republican victory. The General Election of 1921 saw the election of six women to the Second Dáil.
