After all, variability still remains a challenge to descriptive linguistics as well, and CA can only be as good as the description on which it is based.

Error analysis studies, however, have indicated that certain errors recur among language learners of various L1 backgrounds and seem to be more related to the intrinsic difficulty of the subsystem involved than cross-lingual influence.
