Sometimes, the use of assessment results can be a challenge, especially when they are perceived as not being relevant, valid or credible. They may be incomplete or not actionable.

First, the objective of the lesson, or what it is the children are meant to learn, should help determine how we know learning has happened.

#3 Use an image choice if possible Images can be a fun and engaging way to get answers from your respondents. A lot of assessments can use a visual touch. For example, an image choice question could be: "Which color screams extroversion?" #4 Avoid using leading questions. A leading question forces the respondent to answer in a particular way.

Every risk assessment matrix has two axes: one that measures the consequence impact and the other measures likelihood. To use a risk matrix, extract the data from the risk assessment form and plug it into the matrix accordingly. Green is low risk. Yellow is medium risk. Orange is high risk.
