More than a century ago, when ecology was a new word, our founders organized what is now called Native Plant Trust to stop the destruction of native plants. Today, as native plants face the greatest wave of threats since the last mass extinction, we are still a national leader in native plant conservation, horticulture, and education.

The Native Plant Trust, founded in 1900 as the Society for the Protection of Native Plants, and long known as the New England Wild Flower Society, is the nation's first plant conservation organization. The society is dedicated to the preservation of native plants and operates Garden in the Woods (a native plant botanical garden) at its headquarters in Framingham, Massachusetts.

The garden is home to the largest collection of wildflowers in New England. It was the dream and creation of one man, Will Curtis, beginning in 1931. The 45 acre garden was turned over to the New England Wildflower Society in 1965. We found it a pleasant, although not overwhelming, diversion for the afternoon.
