It depends mainly on the hitch and vehicle specifications. The Class V hitches, which are used as WC (weight carrying) are rated to 12,000 lbs. GTW (gross trailer weight) and it can handle the maximum weight of 1200 lbs for trailer tongue (TW).

Class 2 trailer hitches are too much for a small passenger car and require a midsize sedan, a small truck or a minivan to haul a trailer. Because they can pull up to 3,500 pounds, Class 2 hitches are ideal for hauling equipment such as snowmobiles, lightweight boats and small single axle trailers with a gross trailer weight of 3500 or less.

Understanding Trailer Hitch Class Ratings Trailer hitches are organized by classes, with each class rated to indicate it's maximum towing weight capacity and tongue weight. A tow hitch with a class 3 hitch rating, for example, has a towing capacity that's higher than a class 1 hitch.

The trailer hitches, of which there are four classes, have been defined by the SAE (Society of Automotive Engineers) based on the trailer's weight and the cargo and the Gross Weight Towed Weight Rating (GTWR). It is important to note that the weight a vehicle can tow is not determined by the hitch class attached to the vehicle.

A Class 1 trailer hitch can handle a gross trailer weight (GTW) of up to 2,000 lbs., and a maximum tongue weight of 200 lbs. The hitch may be a simple draw bar-type hitch or step bumper-type hitch. Other hitches may have a crossbar with a small one-inch or 1-1/2-inch square receiver, or a small 2-inch by 5/8-inch receiver.

The weight load carried by the hitch at its connection with the trailer coupling shall not, when on a level surface, exceed the maximum tongue weight load recommended by the manufacturer for the hitch but in no case shall the tongue weight load exceed that specified in table 3 for the class of trailers and type of hitch used.
